
















El Condor - passing reference

There's sort of a reference to a fugue by Bach in the second mandolin part. Can you spot it?

























Hootenanny Hoedown - with turkey ....














### **Bell Hornpipe**

I had the idea of using the Westminster chimes as a fugue subject but also had of the sound of a hornpipe in my head, and so decided to combine the two. The rather clangy bell section in the middle is deliberate as bells are often a little discordant, but it also gives the opportunity for the bell like quality of the mandolin to be used to good effect.


