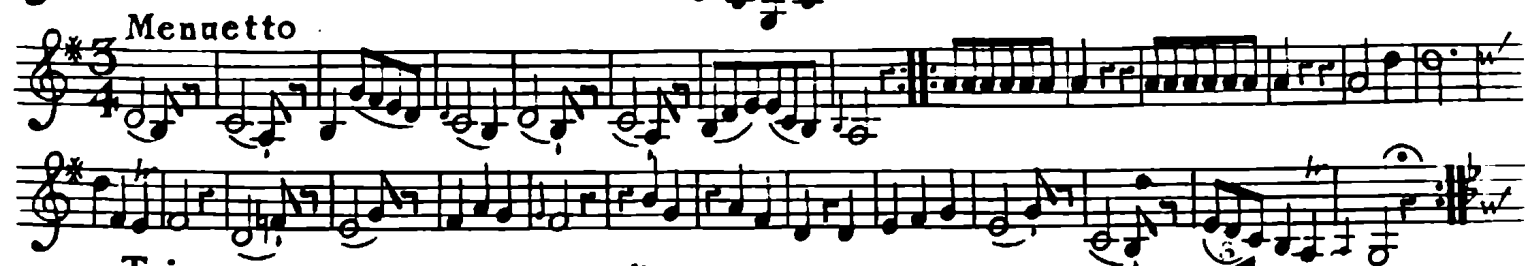

Adagio

Menuetto



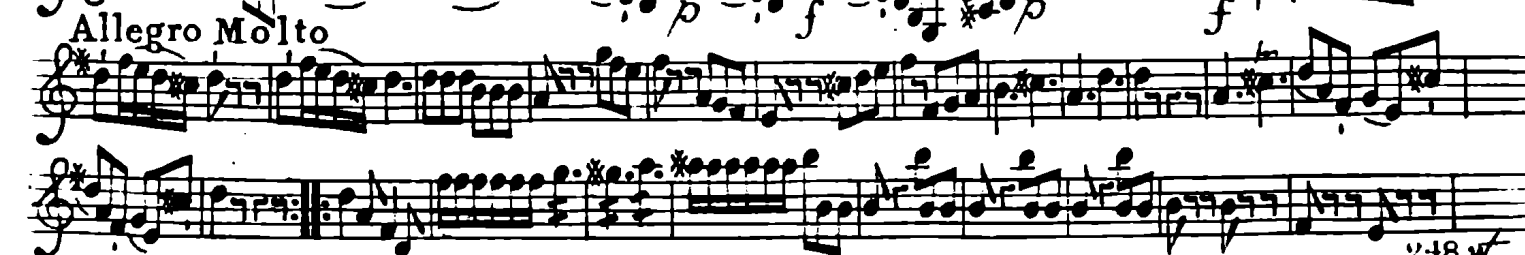
